

**LEGAL NOTICE:** A class action settlement affects you if you purchased a new Bonaire BCH9208 Ceramic Tower Heater in California for your own use and not for resale at any time after March 20, 2010. The Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, authorized this Notice. The lawsuit claimed that the Product at issue is defective and that if Plaintiff had known of the defect, she would not have purchased the Product or would have paid less for the Product. Plaintiff alleged that normal, intended use of the Product results in overheating. Defendant does not believe Plaintiff's claims have merit and has denied and continues to deny any and all claims, including but not limited to claims of defect and/or allegations concerning the safety of the Product.

**WHO IS INCLUDED:** The Court has decided that everyone who fits this description is a Class Member: All persons within the State of California who purchased a new Bonaire BCH9208 Ceramic Tower Heater for their own use and not for resale at any time since March 20, 2010. Excluded from the Class are Defendant, Defendant's affiliates, subsidiaries, or co-conspirators, employees of Defendant, including its officers and directors, the Court to which this case is assigned, and any persons who have already returned and have been refunded for their heater.

**SETTLEMENT BENEFITS:** To qualify for compensation, you must be a Class Member and you must submit a Claim Form by March 4, 2020. Claim Forms may be submitted online at [www.HeaterSettlement.com](http://www.HeaterSettlement.com) or downloaded and submitted by mail or email. Class Members who submit timely claims have two benefit options: (1) \$25 cash refund if the power cord from the heater is cut and returned along with a photograph of the heater; or (2) \$12.50 cash refund or \$17.50 purchase credit to be applied toward new purchases from [www.holmesproducts.com](http://www.holmesproducts.com) and will be valid for one hundred eighty (180) days from the date of issuance (this option does not require the power cord to be cut). Proof of purchase is required for either option unless you are a verified purchaser of the heater from Costco.

**YOUR OPTIONS:** If you don't want compensation and you don't want to be legally bound by the Settlement, you must exclude yourself by March 4, 2020, or you won't be able to sue, or continue to sue, Defendant about the legal claims in this case. If you stay in the Class, you may object to the Settlement by March 4, 2020. The detailed Notice describes how to exclude yourself or object. The Court will hold a Final Approval Hearing in this case (*Trepte v. Bonaire, Inc.*, Case No. BC540110) on June 3, 2020, to consider whether to approve the Settlement and attorneys' fees up to \$339,472.17 and expenses up to \$138,027.83 and a payment to the Class Representative of up to \$7,500.
